

The town board meeting was held on June 9, 2026 at the town justice building.

Councilman Voght led us in the pledge of allegiance.

Supervisor Bronner called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

The town clerk read the minutes from May 12, 2026. Supervisor Bronner asked if there were any corrections, additions, or changes to the minutes. Councilman Valenta made a motion to approve and Councilman Armstrong seconded. All approved.

First item on the agenda Supervisor Bronner passed a letter written by Councilman Valenta regarding the conditions of the roads to be sent to the county and state. If no corrections, additions, or changes from the town board, Supervisor Bronner will forward to the town attorney for his approval. A motion was needed to approve the letter. Councilman Voght made a motion to approve and Councilman Armstrong seconded. All approved. Supervisor Bronner then talked of the completion of the sand, salt barn. Superintendent Hajczewski advised the building should be completed by the next town board meeting but the paving not until late August. Supervisor Bronner asked for any suggestions about an electrician to install the electric from the main building to the sand, salt barn. Supervisor Bronner checked with Jerry Stucchi and was informed the town would need a three bid quote. If the cost was less than \$30,000.00, we would not need one. Matt Dawson from Canadara Electric was suggested. Supervisor Bronner then passed to the town board the state board of assessment for equalization rate for the coming year, the invoice for the state snow for March, and a crossing guard payment that was received from the school. Supervisor Bronner advised the primary elections will be held on June 23, 2026 at the town justice building for the state and federal offices. Supervisor Bronner received a notification form Herkimer County Land Bank regarding property at 1270 Chyle Road that was bought by Howard Young for demolition. The codes officer needs to make sure he is compliant with all NYS and local building codes. Supervisor Bronner then passed notification of mortgage taxes paid to the town and the cable tv revenue from Spectrum in town. Also advised the town board fuel bids are due. The town board agreed to wait until August in case prices lower.

Superintendent Hajczewski talked to Nicole Harris from chips. They would pay for the cost of an addition on the town garage to have enough storage for the spare trucks. The town received in total from chips \$167,797.85.

Councilman Voght asked about the judge's books to audit. Supervisor Bronner hadn't heard from Deb since the last town board meeting. The town may have to give up the judgeship and combine with another town.

Discussion once again about the windmills and what monies the town would receive. Otherwise, Supervisor Bronner had not heard or been in contact with anyone regarding the windmills.

The town board reviewed the Supervisor's report. Councilman Valenta made a motion to approve and Councilman Armstrong seconded. All approved.

The town board reviewed the town clerk's report consisting of a copy of a certified marriage certificate, a certified death certificate, and four building permits for the total of \$140.00. Councilman Valenta made a motion to approve and Councilman Armstrong seconded. All approved.

The town board reviewed the General and Highway vouchers to pay the bills. Councilman Armstrong made a motion to pay the bills and Councilman Voght seconded. All approved.

The next meeting will be held on July 14, 2026 at 7:00 pm. Councilman Voght made a motion to adjourn and Councilman Valenta seconded. All approved. Meeting was adjourned at 8:10 pm.
