

The town board meeting was held on July 14, 2026 at the town justice building.

Councilman Armstrong led us in the pledge of allegiance.

Supervisor Bronner called the meeting to order t 7:00 pm.

The town clerk read the minutes from June 9, 2026. Supervisor Bronner asked if there were any corrections, additions, or changes to the minutes. Councilman Armstrong made a motion to approve and Councilman Valenta seconded. All approved.

Supervisor Bronner opened the public portion of the meeting at 7:06 pm. A question was asked about the letter that was written by Councilman Valenta regarding the conditions of the roads. Supervisor Bronner advised there were no changes made to the letter and was given to the town attorney to read and was approved. Supervisor Bronner then spoke with Mark Walzak and had verbal conversations with an aide in charge from Assemblyman Smullen's office. Supervisor Bronner received assurances that they would look into it. Supervisor Bronner sent the notification to the state Dot in Utica to Linda Luby and Matthew Howard. A petition will be taken from the residents and non-residents that travel these roads such as ambulances, fire company trucks, etc. to be included along with the letters to be sent to the state and county. The open portion of the meeting was closed at 7:16 pm.

Supervisor Bronner advised that fuel bids were put in the newspaper and also paperwork for fuel bids were sent to Superior Plus, Nolan Propane, Mirabito, Center State Propane, and Buell Fuels.

Supervisor Bronner received a notification from Text.gov to obtain a list of resident's emails and text phone numbers for the water district in case of any emergencies they should be made aware of. The fee is \$2500.00. The town board needs to discuss if the cost is worthwhile and if it is a good idea or not. Notices would still have to be given to the residents for the water district.

The judge will be resigning in September and there is someone interested in filling the judge's position but Deb has advised there needs to be a court clerk for whoever would take over the judgeship. There was much discussion about the internet service at the town justice building which has been a problem for the judge.

Supervisor Bronner received notification from Stark Tech, the company who does the work on the generator for the water district, a cost of \$1501.00 an annual fee for two services and one annual complete service of everything. There was much discussion of an alternative but the town has been

fortunate with the service from Stark Tech. Supervisor Bronner needed a motion to approve. Councilman Valenta made a motion to approve and Councilman Hubiak seconded. All approved.

The town board reviewed the Supervisor's report. Councilman Armstrong made a motion to approve and Councilman Valenta seconded. All approved.

The town board reviewed the town clerk's report consisting of one building application and two dog licenses for the amount of \$403.00. Councilman Armstrong made a motion to approve and Councilman Valenta seconded. All approved.

The town board reviewed the General and Highway vouchers to pay the bills. Councilman Armstrong made a motion to pay the bills and Councilman Valenta seconded. All approved.

The next meeting will be held on August 11, 2026 at 7:00 pm. Councilman Valenta made a motion to adjourn and Councilman Hubiak seconded. Meeting was adjourned at 8:15 pm.
